It has 14 factories and 20 sales divisions across the world, with its headquarters in Stein, Germany. The Faber-Castell Group employs roughly 7,000 people and operates in over 100 countries. The family that created Faber-Castell and continues to run the company is known as the House of Faber-Castell. Every year, they produce roughly 2 billion pencils in over 120 distinct colours.
